

ENROLLMENT

We ask all patrons requesting full-time care for their child to visit www.militarychildcare.com. Once care is available, the patron will need to complete a registration packet. An up-to-date immunizations record and a copy of your most current Leave and Earnings Statement/Payroll Statement are required. The CDC staff will use this information to complete a DD Form 2652, Verification of Total Family Income, to calculate your child care payments. All paperwork must be completed prior to child's first day.

WHAT WE DO

The Moody AFB Child Development Center provides quality full-time care for children six weeks to five years of age. The children of Active Duty Military, Department of Defense Civilians (NAF or APF), Reservists on Active Duty or during active duty training and Department of Defense Contractors are all eligible to receive care. The CDC gives priority to Active Duty/DoD Sponsors with a spouse that is employed or currently going to school. Parents must notify the CDC when their employment or student status changes.

ACCREDITATION

The Child Development Center is accredited by the National Association of Education for Young Children. Early childhood programs achieving accreditation have voluntarily undergone a comprehensive internal self-study process and have been validated to be in substantial criteria compliance. A high quality early childhood program provides a safe and nurturing environment while promoting the physical, social, emotional and cognitive development of young children.



CURRICULUM

Early Learning Matters (ELM) is an Air Force wide curriculum that was created in partnership with Purdue University to promote all areas of development from birth to 5 years of age. ELM provides developmentally sequenced activities that provide strategies for individualization and bolster school readiness along with life success. The activity plans that ELM provides build on children's pathways of development in five infant/toddler areas and eight preschool areas.

CLOSED CIRCUIT VIDEO MONITORING

All children and staff are on constant closed circuit video monitoring also referred to as CCTV. Please feel free to watch the monitors at the front desk. Due to Privacy Act Information, parents that are requesting a copy of any video must put in a request through the Base FOIA Privacy Act Officer.

FOOD CARE PROGRAM

The CDC participates in the Child and Adult Care Food Program sponsored by the US Department of Agriculture and Bright from the Start. We provide nutritious meals and snacks for all children.

SIGN-UP & REGISTRATION

We ask all patrons requesting full-time care for their child to visit www.militarychildcare.com. Once care is available, the patron will need to complete a profile on Child and Youth Program Business Modernization. Up-to-date immunizations record and a copy of your most recent Leave and Earnings Statement/Payroll Statement are required. The CDC staff will use this information to calculate Total Family Income, to calculate child care payments. The profile must be completed prior to the child's first day.

CHILDCARE SUBLETTING

Kinderspot is available for childcare subletting. It's used to offer or rent temporary spots at the Air Force Child Development Centers within a network vetted and eligible families.
